Even with the survey, there hasn't been a great cry for change. Those who have asked for change either wanted one of the Masses moved to an earlier or later time, but the number of people wanting one of the Masses earlier and those wanting it later were about equal. There is no groundswell of agreement about what change should happen. Therefore, I believe no change is necessary at this time. For the very few who want a fourth Mass added at whatever time, the same reasons we had for eliminating a Sunday Mass time are the same reasons for not adding a fourth Mass, no matter what time that would be. For the present, our schedule will stay as it is.
