**Heating and Cooling the Church**

A note in the suggestion box this week asked about keeping the church at a “comfortable temperature”. I’m all for that. However, it isn’t as easy as setting a thermostat like you would in your house. The large room that is our church has three thermostats that control the air conditioning and each one controls a separate air conditioning unit. In a space the size of our church, three controls aren’t very many.

While the church room is large, it still is small enough that the addition of 200 to 300 bodies within 15 minutes with the accompanying number of times the doors are opened caused the temperature to rise dramatically. Therefore, if you arrive for Mass early, you may find the church feels rather cool. This is done intentionally to compensate for the influx of heat that is about to happen. Usually, by the time Mass starts, the temperature in the church moderates and becomes “comfortable”. The same dynamic occurs in the winter, but since we all have coats on, it isn’t as noticeable except on the coldest days.

Of course, there are always days that don’t follow the norms on which we base our planning. Also, different parts of the church heat or cool differently from other parts. Our heating and cooling equipment are not geared up to handle every contingency, and so days that are unseasonable may prove a little uncomfortable in church, and certain areas of the church may not be as comfortable as others. These are just the limitations of our older heating and cooling systems. I believe we are doing the best we can with what we have.

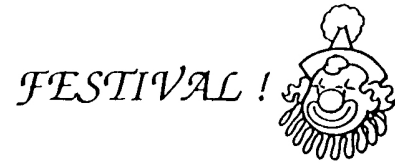
